MISSION STATEMENT

St. Peter Claver Catholic Church is a vibrant, spirit-filled, evangelizing community that is grounded in the Eucharist and celebrates the culture and traditions of our African-American heritage.

Strengthened by our belief in Jesus Christ and trusting in God's Word, we transform our community through acts of justice by caring for the spiritual and physical needs of His people.

SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS

The readings from Genesis and the Gospel of Luke present us with scenes in the lives of two important families. The account from Genesis depicts Abram's frustration at not having fathered a child. When God consoles Abram with another promise of offspring, Abram responds by placing his faith in God. In turn, the text tells us that "the Lord took note of Sarah," and she gave birth to their long-awaited son.

The refrain from Psalm 105, "The Lord remembers his covenant forever," reinforces the message of the Genesis readings.

In the Letter to the Hebrews, the author summarizes the story of Abraham and identifies him as a person of faith. Upon hearing this summary of Abraham's life, the words of the Psalm refrain are readily brought back to mind. Although Abraham struggled with believing that God could make Sarah fruitful, Abraham "put his faith in the Lord," and for this reasons, the praises of Abraham are extolled in the New Testament.

Luke tells us of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple. While Simeon and Anna are depicted as having long awaited the coming of this child, Mary and Joseph are described as being "amazed at what was said of him." Upon the family's return to Nazareth, the child Jesus "grew and became strong, filled with wisdom, and the favor of God was upon him." The following verses in Luke, vv. 41-52, tell the story of Jesus, at age twelve, in the Temple.

- The next time you have a clear view of the heavens, reflect on God's unfailing love.
- Read today's Responsorial Psalm. Give thanks for specific blessings you have received.
- Simeon's words in the Gospel are a part of the Church's Night Prayer. Reflect on why these words are appropriate for the end of day.



Similarities and Differences between Flu and COVID-19

How long someone can spread the virus?

Similarities: For both COVID-19 and flu, it's possible to spread the virus for at least 1 day before experiencing any symptoms. Differences: If a person has COVID-19, they may be contagious for a longer period of time than if they had flu.

FLU

Most people with flu are contagious for about 1 day before they show symptoms. Older children and adults with flu appear to be most contagious during the initial 3-4 days of their illness but many remain contagious for about 7 days. Infants and people with weakened immune systems can be contagious for even longer.

How Flu Spreads

COVID-19: How long someone can spread the virus that causes COVID-19 is till under investigation.

It's possible for people to spread the virus for about 2 days before experiencing signs or symptoms and remain contagious for at least 10 days after signs or symptoms first appeared. If someone is asymptomatic or their symptoms go away, it's possible to remain contagious for at least 10 days after testing positive for COVID-19.

How COVID-19 Spreads: Similarities: Both COVID-19 and flu can spread from person-toperson, between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet). Both are spread mainly by droplets made when people with the illness (COVID-19) or flu) cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. It may be possible that a person can get infected by physical human contact (e.g., shaking hands) or by touching a surface or object that has virus on it and then touching his or her own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes. Both flu virus and the virus that causes COVID-19 may be spread to others by people when they begin showing symptoms, with very mild symptoms or who never developed symptoms (asymptomatic).

Bible Study Quote:

"Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Luke 1:30

What are you looking for? Are you looking for God's Favor? In Psalm 90:17 the psalmist prays that the works of his hands prosper by the favor or grace of God. He, like us, seeks the righteousness that comes only form God. Favor or grace is a gift from God. We cannot earn it, nor can we produce it. However, we believe that grace is enabled by our prayer life. Prayer makes us more available for God's grace. In prayer we seek God's favor and grace. Grace is amazing, since it is so transforming. Grace provides enthusiasm to do God's will, which allows us to live in the joy of the Most High God. Grace saves us from this world and from ourselves, as God sees us. The appropriate response to favor or grace is faith. The fulfillment of grace in the human soul is elegantly portrayed in the life of Mary, the mother of Jesus. In the Gospel of St. Luke, we read that Mary found favor with God. She was declared favored and full of grace in a time when the nation of Israel was oppressed by Roman authority. Like David in the first reading, she provides a model for us as we seek God's grace and favor as our nation approaches 300,00 deaths from the Corona Virus Pandemic. What are you looking for?

In the first reading, we see that David found favor with God because of his charity and fidelity. His fidelity is shown by his desire to build a temple for God out of cedar like the palace he had built for himself. God's favor or grace for David was revealed by the Prophet, Nathan, in what is called the Dynastic Oracle. The Oracle established a paternal relationship between David and God (v. 14; see Ps. 2:7, 89:27. David was so favored by God that he would not be allowed to build a dwelling for the Lord.
